Standard Bank Bursary Programme 2019 Application INFORMATION LETTER

Dear Applicant

Please read the instructions before completing the application form.

- 1. General Instructions
- 1.1 The completed application form must be submitted before 31 August 2018 if you want to be considered for a Standard Bank CSI bursary for 2019.
- 1.2 Only application forms completed correctly, in full and accompanied by the required supporting documents will be considered.
- 1.3 We encourage applicants to make use of the online application facility http://www.studytrust.org.za. Alternatively email your completed form and supporting documents to apply@studytrust.org.za or fax your completed form and supporting documents to 086 538 1537.
- 1.4 Only applications from South African citizens will be considered.
- 1.5 Please apply timeously for admission for next year to the educational institution of your choice.

- 1.7 An application made on a StudyTrust application form will be considered for all the bursaries we manage. Applicants are advised to apply for as many other bursaries that are not managed by us, as possible. A list of available bursaries can be obtained from the National Career Development Services (see 1.6).
- 2. Supporting Documents
- 2.1 A certified copy of this year's June results, or NSC / matric results or your complete academic record if you are at a tertiary institution.
- 2.2 A copy of your provisional admission letter to the institution you applied to study at.
- 2.3 A certified copy of your ID document.
- 2.4 Proof of Income:
 - Certified copies of pay-slips of your parent(s) / guardian.
 - A copy of the latest audited financial statements or a sworn affidavit declaring monthly income if your parent(s) / guardian is / are self-employed.
 - A certified copy of the latest pay-slip of your guardian if you reside with your guardian even though your parent(s) is / are still alive.
 - Swom affidavits if your parent(s) / guardian is / are unemployed.
- 2.5 A certified copy of a death certificate or a sworn affidavit in the case of deceased parent(s) / guardian / spouse.
- 2.6 A certified copy of the divorce certificate if your parents are divorced.
- 2.7 If your parents are separated, a sworn statement from one of them confirming their separation.
- 3. Selection Criteria
 - The main criteria used in the selection of successful applicants to the Standard Bank CSI bursary are <u>academic excellence</u>, <u>financial need</u>, <u>year of study in 2019</u>, and admission to the <u>designated study programme</u>. Other selection criteria are:
- The prestigious Standard Bank CSI bursary programme targets high performing candidates who consistently obtained distinctions in Mathematics and, if applicable for the proposed study programme, Physical Science. The minimum requirements are: A 70% average and not less than 75% for Mathematics, 70% for Physical Science and 70% for English FAL (or 60% for English HL). However, successful candidates in the past presented no fewer than 5 distinctions.
- 3.2 Financial need: The Standard Bank CSI bursary is for candidates whose parent(s) or guardian(s) would not be able to afford sending them to university without having to make use of financial aid.
- 3.3 Year of study in 2019: Only applicants who will be in their first year of study in 2019 will be considered for the Standard Bank CSI bursary.

3.1 Academic excellence: Selection will be done on the basis of June Grade 12 results and, if available, Grade 12 pre-lim results.

- 3.4 Designated study programmes: The Standard Bank CSI bursary is only available to candidates in the following study areas: Commerce (B Com and B Business Science), Engineering (B Sc and B Eng Engineering), B Sc Agriculture and B Sc or B Bus Science Actuarial Science. Applicants must please specify as clearly as possible the exact programme of study for which you need a bursary as well as the name of the educational institution where you plan to study. Study programme changes, after submitting your application forms, may lead to the cancellation of a bursary.
- 3.5 No bursaries are available for private tertiary institutions.
- 4. The value of the Standard Bank CSI bursary
 - The Standard Bank CSI bursary is a full-cost bursary, covering the following study and study-related costs:
- 4.1 University fees
- 4.2 Accommodation in a university residence or in private accommodation. Private accommodation costs will be subject to certain limits, to be explained to successful candidates upon the provisional bursary allocation.
- 4.3 Meals provided by the university or self-catering.
- 4.4 Books and other study materials.
- 4.5 A laptop computer.
- 4.6 A monthly stipend to cover other living costs.
- 4.7 Transport between home and campus 4 times a year at the cost of a bus ticket.
- 5. Submitted Application Forms: Acknowledgement of Receipt and Outcome
- 5.1 Receipt: You will receive sms confirmation upon receipt of your completed application form. Online applications receive an immediate response acknowledging submission of the application. All properly completed applications received will be considered.
- 5.2 Outcome: You may expect an email to the address provided in your application informing you of the outcome of your application by 31 December. Please inquire only after 15 January next year if by that time you still have had no answer.
